Do you like to draw? Imagine your Mom put one of your pictures on the refrigerator. The next day the refrigerator broke and a repair man came to fix it. What could he learn about you by looking at your picture? He might learn you like horses, because your picture is of a horse. He would know your favorite color is blue because you used it so often. What we do and how we do it says a lot about who we are and what we are like.

It's the same with God. One way we learn about God is by looking at what he has made. Think about the sun, moon and stars; what do they teach us about God?
